## What Is the Legend of the Dogwood Tree?

Question: "What is the legend of the dogwood tree? Was the cross Jesus was crucified on made of dogwood?"

Answer: The Bible does not tell us what type of wood the cross Jesus was crucified on was made of. Roman history does not go into specifics as to how the crosses were made or what type of wood was used. There is a legend that the cross was made of dogwood. This is unlikely considering the typical size of a dogwood tree. The legend of the dogwood tree, author unknown, is as follows:

In Jesus' time, the dogwood grew  
To a stately size and a lovely hue.  
'Twas strong and firm, its branches interwoven.  
For the cross of Christ its timbers were chosen.  
Seeing the distress at this use of their wood  
Christ made a promise which still holds good:  
"Never again shall the dogwood grow  
Large enough to be used so.  
Slender and twisted, it shall be  
With blossoms like the cross for all to see.  
As blood stains the petals marked in brown,  
The blossom's center wears a thorny crown.  
All who see it will remember Me  
Crucified on a cross from the dogwood tree.  
Cherished and protected, this tree shall be  
A reminder to all of My agony."<sup>1</sup>

Again, this is just a legend. It is a nice poem, but there is no biblical basis to it.

The Common Grounds Annual Report has been completed for 2021. We thought it might be helpful for you to know some statistics that will help you see the impact our mission outreach is making on our local community. They are the following:

Families Common Grounds helped	-	973
Actual Number of People helped	-	2311
Number of New Families	-	83
Average Monthly Income	-	\$737.93

In addition, the number of volunteers from our church who served in different capacities was 21. This number does not include our faithful Knit Wits who have made us dish cloths and baby blankets to distribute so they should be included as well. We'd welcome you! It might be helpful to know that we are only open from 10:00 AM- 2:00 PM on Tuesdays and Thursdays if that is a consideration.

Again this year we have applied to our West Virginia Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church for one of their Hunger Grants. If we receive one of their grants those funds will assist us in providing more fresh vegetables, fresh fruits, milk, eggs, and frozen meat on a more regular basis. Our goal is to provide our families with enough food to last 2 ½ - 3 days at each visit in addition to healthier food. If you would like to donate food this month, please consider CANNED FRUIT (preferably in their own juices), CANNED SPAGHETTI SAUCE, and/or BOXED OATMEAL. You may place them in the woven trunk in the open recessed area in the Narthex.
