Questions for Session Seven

2. Assuming he had the official letters regarding those worshiping at the synagogues in Damascus, what did Saul encounter along the way? Explain.
3. How did his fellow travelers react to Christ's presence during Saul's divine encounter? How did they treat Saul afterward? Were they eyewitnesses to this event?

6. What did the LORD specifically tell Ananias (vv. 15-16) about how he would use Saul to further Jesus' work? What did Ananias do to fulfill the LORD's will?
7. What did Saul do after he regained his health, and how had the tables turned on him with respect to his previous occupation? Was his ministry to last in Damascus?
8. How was Saul received by the disciples at Jerusalem? Explain what happened to him there. Where was he sent next? Who helped him?
