John 20:1-18



Scripture teaches us that early on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene went to the tomb, and she discovered the stone had been rolled away from its place blocking the entrance.

Why is it important for us to hear that she went for help among the leaders of Jesus' followers? Why did she assume that someone had taken his body?

Tuesday, April 6, 2021

Isaiah 25:6-9



This prophetic passage describes a feast, which will take place on a specific mountain. The writer describes in detail (1) who will be served, (2) what will be served, and (3) what will happen.

Connect the dots and explain the connection between the Crucifixion and what is described in v. 6. What else can you connect to Jesus' divine mission?

Wednesday, April 7, 2021

Psalm 118:1-2, 14-24



In this psalm of joy and thanksgiving the writer gives us a description of what the LORD has done, and of what the LORD will do for us in the future.

How do you recognize—*on a regular basis*—what the LORD had done in your life? How do you give thanks and praise to the LORD for his blessings? How do you recognize these elements of change as opportunities for hope?

Thursday, April 8, 2021

Acts 10:34-43



Our passage from the Acts of the Apostles teaches us that the message of the Good News is meant for all of humanity. Peter tells us that God does not show any favoritism, and that all of us are to fear the LORD.

What else does Peter teach in vv. 42-43? What is your personal response to this teaching? What impact will this teaching have on your future?
