**Monday, May 11, 2020**

**John 14:1-14**



In his *Farewell Discourse* Jesus continues teaching the disciples. While they followed him for three years, they are still *infants* in their understanding.

Why was it difficult for them to perceive Jesus' real message for them—*his vision and his mission*—as they heard him teach? How can we move beyond being infants in our understanding of Jesus' real purpose?

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**Tuesday, May 12, 2020**

**Acts 7:55-60**



This scriptural narrative of Stephen's stoning stands as the stark reality to the dangers of following Christ in the first century. Even though post-Christian believers rarely face stoning, there is still resistance from the world.

As you live your life for Christ, and as you speak the truth to others regarding your faith, what are the consequences to you? Explain and share examples.

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**Wednesday, May 13, 2020**

**Psalm 31:1-5, 15-16**



This Psalm, which like so many others, tells of the trust and hope the writer has in God. There is also a strong request of the psalmist *to save and to protect* and *to deliver* from danger, that person/s who trust in God.

While this is not supposed to sound like *bargaining*, how can we keep our prayers out of the realm of *bargaining* and remain focused on our trust in God?

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**Thursday, May 14, 2020**

**1 Peter 2:2-10**



This passage from 1 Peter revolves around the *spiritual reality* of the people hearing the message. We are several Sundays removed from the resurrection of Christ, yet we continue to celebrate that resurrection.

What is your *spiritual reality* in the life you are currently living? How can this letter speak to you while you are at this place in your life? Explain in detail.

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
