Matthew 10:40-42

Tuesday, June 30, 2020

Romans 6:12-23



The concept of slavery in the Apostle Paul's world was very different than our notion of the social sin of several centuries in this country.

How can we read this passage and relate its message to our lives in light of our take on slavery coupled with our modern-day desire to live according to the following motto? *Life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness!* Explain.
