Tuesday, September 1, 2020

Thursday, September 3, 2020

Romans 12:9-21



This passage gives the reader an extended definition of love, and how we are to act out of our love of God in our lives. Love takes on real action in the life of the followers of Christ, and becomes less like an emotion or sentiment.

What are some of the ways Paul is instructing the hearer/reader in acting out of love? How do you act out of love for God in your life?
