Ezekiel 18:1-4, 25-32



Ezekiel is recounting a prophetic story that the LORD gave him to share with the people. While we might not initially get it, vv. 1-4 are explained to be about sin and the judgment and punishment that follows.

According to Ezekiel’s prophetic word who pays for the sin? How does the teaching in vv. 25-32 illustrate God’s love and God’s judgment? Explain.

Thursday, October 1, 2020

Philippians 2:1-13



Paul addresses the Philippians with a statement regarding their individual faithfulness and their relationships with each other. He addresses the necessity of their treating one other with a Christlike love and humility.

How does Paul challenge us two thousand years later to allow God to work within us? How are you acting according to God’s good purpose for you?
