Matthew 25:1-13



Jesus uses an allegorical illustration in our gospel lesson. He teaches what the kingdom of heaven will be like using a story of ten virgins waiting for the bridegroom to arrive. Apparently five are not prepared for his arrival.

What was expected from all ten virgins? What were they to take with them? What were they supposed to supply for the light? What happened to them?

Wednesday, November 11, 2020

Psalm 70



Our psalmist, David, is in deep need of deliverance by the LORD. Although his situation is not specified in these verses, David calls out to God to come and to deliver him from his current situation. He does not want God to delay!

How do we seek God in our time of need? How do we praise him and exalt his name when we are not in need? How do we rely on God in our lives?

Tuesday, November 10, 2020

Amos 5:18-24



The prophet, Amos, is foretelling the doom that awaits the people because of their unfaithfulness and their pretense toward God. He is prophesying that God will not honor their religious hypocrisy at the judgment.

Who among us looks forward to the day of the LORD? How can we be sure that our offerings to God are received well? How does God view your faith?

Thursday, November 12, 2020

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18



Paul's letter to the Thessalonians is one of encouragement and purpose for teaching the truth of the gospels. While he is writing about the end times, he is instructing the reader/hearer about the process.

When you read passages like this—*passages that describe the eschaton*—do you find yourself seeking to know more *or* fearing the future? Explain.
