Mark 13:24-37



Our passage begins with “But in those days, following that distress...” John Mark is referring to a specific time and to specific events that have happened, and as a result other things will follow.

To which days is the author speaking, and to what distress is he referring in this passage? What has happened to bring these things that follow? Explain.

Tuesday, December 1, 2020

Isaiah 64:1-9



The prophet, Isaiah, is apparently addressing God in these verses depicting the sad state of affairs of the people. He realizes that they have become unclean and are unable to approach the LORD in their sinful state.

In his despair how has Isaiah addressed the LORD as one among a people wanting to have the relationship restored? What is his claim for the people?

Wednesday, December 2, 2020

Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19



In the first section of this lesson the psalmist seems to be stating the facts of the current situation. The relationship between God and the people is strained, and there seems to be no hope for them.

What does the psalmist do in vv. 17-19? How does he address the LORD in a way that gives a sense of hope to himself and the people? Explain.

Thursday, December 3, 2020

1 Corinthians 1:3-9



In this lesson Paul opens with a greeting to the people and an acknowledgment of their faithfulness to God. He sees their “testimony about Christ that was confirmed in them.” He continues that they do not lack any spiritual gifts.

What is Paul calling these people in the early Church to do? How will their relationship with God keep them strong? Recite v. 8. Does it give you strength?
