How does the psalmist describe the men in v. 1c? Describe their behavior in v. 2. What are they requesting of the LORD in v. 4? Explain.

Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11

Isaiah, the prophet, begins our lesson with a call to God to come down and show his almighty power to his people. He further claims that the people are the clay, whom God will shape as the potter.

What is Isaiah petitioning of God in v. 9? What is Isaiah describing in vv. 10-11? What can we learn from this here in the twenty-first century?

1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

In this Pauline letter there are specific instructions for the church and its people at Thessalonica. Thankfulness seems to be at the root of all that Paul is teaching. His instruction leads to a deepening relationship with God.

How are the people to resist evil and hold onto good? According to Paul's instruction, who is coming, and how are they to ready themselves?
